Announced at the 2023 Statewide Municipal Partnerships Conference, the Healey-Driscoll administration launched a new Massachusetts Federal Funds Partnership for Municipalities and Tribes to assist with their efforts to apply for and win federal funding. The Partnership will convene monthly and is open to elected leaders and staff from all 357 cities, towns and federally recognized tribes in Massachusetts. The first call is scheduled for Wednesday, October 25, 2023 from 11:30AM to 12:30PM, and will focus on grant opportunities totaling \$147 million for broadband and \$500 million for school bus electrification. 11/28: MassDOT Community Transit Grant Program Funding Opportunity

Mark your calendars! MassDOT is excited to announce that applications for the FY24 Community Transit Grant Program (CTGP) for new vehicles will open on Tuesday, November 28, and are due by Friday, December 22.

The CTGP is an annual competitive program that awards funds to help meet the transportation and mobility needs of seniors and people with disabilities. Application forms will become available here starting November 28. MassDOT anticipates making award announcements in Spring 2024, with vehicles to be delivered by June 30, 2025.

NMCOG awarded Regional Energy Planning Assistance Grant

The Department of Energy Resources (DOER) has awarded NMCOG a grant of \$69,750 through the Regional Energy Planning Assistance (REPA) grant program. This grant includes \$50,000 to support regional capacity building and project implementation efforts in our region, including continuing our Regional Clean Energy and Sustainability Workshops and supporting the regional Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) planning efforts. In addition to regional funding, the remainder of the grant award was allocated to provide technical assistance to our member communities with Green Communities activities, including annual reporting preparation.
